1. Hazel formally welcomed everyone to the annual review.
2. James introduced the Friday Beavers to start the section reviews. The Beavers produce photos of their year and verbally explained what they had been up to. Ang gave a presentation on Monday Beavers work throughout the year with a couple of Beavers in attendance (this is not their usual night to attend). Duncan gave a verbal presentation on the work of Monday Cubs (again not their night to attend). Friday Cubs sang songs they had learnt at Cubs and along with Sarah and Margery who encouraged parent participation. Mike presented the work of the scouts verbally then showed a DVD of activities from the year. Donald gave a verbal presentation on the work of the Explorers this year.
3. Hazel made presentations to Beavers and Cubs that were present.
4. Chairman's Report delivered by Hazel. Highlighting 200 young people in attendance last year within the 82nd Craigalmond Scout

Group. Making up over 2000 young people and 270 leaders within the district. As we have no GSL Hazel took on the role of making the presentations.

5. Treasurers Report was delivered by Stuart. The group funds are in a healthy position with £3k being ring fenced to pay for repairs to the Sea Scout Store.

Subs to remain at £80 for Beavers and Cubs, £85 for Scouts and £65 for Explorers with the £10 early payment discount in place until the end of October 2015.

Gift aid increase the group funds and we will continue to pursue this. Potentially £3k through gift aid.

Hazel thanked Stuart for his efforts with managing the subs and gift aid.

6. New Leaders – Help is required for the sections covering the younger years of Beavers and Cubs. Hazel presented the volunteers role and expectations along with the support and training available for leaders. Hazel invited parents to join the leaders and the executive for an informal reception after the review to chat over leading and supporting the group.
7. AOCB The Duck Race will take place on the 13th June all encouraged to attend as this supports the sections and is a fund raiser for the Explorer international trip.
Queen's Scout Award presented to Morgan. Rhoda gave an explanation to the path way to achieving the highest award in Scouting.
